Failure to Pay



- What rate is acceptable?
- Risk to agency
 - Loss of revenue
 - Rating agencies
 - Paying customers
 - Community confidence and support

Texas Transportation Code Sec 370.177



- Violation results in charge of the original toll plus an Administrative Fee:
 - up to \$100/transaction (by statue)
 - CRRMA to charge \$15/Toll Bill (not/transaction)
- 30 days to pay
- Court is an option
- Misdemeanor punishable by fine <u>up to</u> \$250/ transaction
- Firm but fair


Violation Enforcement Systems



- Cameras take images of license plates
- Process the images
- Owner information from Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV)
- Bill is mailed to the owner
- Set time to pay
- Failure to pay results in additional administrative fees

System Accuracy



- Test Phases
- Remote On-line Maintenance System (ROMS)
- Annual Audit
- Benefit of the doubt goes to the customer






- MSB
 - Bill Issuer
 - Customer Service Center / Call Center
 - Payment Processor
- Violation Notices (non-payment)
- Customer Oriented
 - May waive fines
 - May waive entire Toll Bill
 - Customer Service Standards











- Complaint Summary
- Proof of Ownership
 - Certified vehicle registration and / or title history
- Proof of Notification & Non-Payment
 - Toll Bill
- Supplemental Information
 - Customer Account History





- Transaction images
- Written correspondence
- MSB contact logs and phone calls
- Toll system maintenance records
- Postal tracking records





- Finalize sample documents with Municipal Court
- Start auto dialer process
- Send last chance letters
- Submit first packets to Municipal Court (approximately 6 weeks depending upon Court schedule)
