

CAMINO REAL REGIONAL MOBILITY AUTHORITY BOARD RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the 82nd Legislature of Texas passed Senate Bill 18 (Truth in Condemnation Procedures Act), which enacted eminent domain reforms including various new requirements on entities such as the Camino Real Regional Mobility Authority (CRRMA) that have eminent domain powers;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Senate Bill 18, all entities with the power of eminent domain must provide the Comptroller of the State of Texas with a letter stating that the entity is authorized to exercise eminent domain and must also provide the legislative authority for such power; and

WHEREAS, the Comptroller has developed a form that entities may use to provide such notice to the Comptroller and the CRRMA desires now to submit such form letter in advance of the December 31, 2012 deadline required by law;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CAMINO REAL REGIONAL MOBILITY AUTHORITY:

THAT the Executive Director be authorized to execute and submit the required documentation of eminent domain authority to the Texas Comptroller pursuant to and in accordance with Senate Bill 18 of the 82nd Legislature of the State of Texas.

Required Documentation of Eminent Domain Authority in Texas

What action must be taken: Per Senate Bill 18 enacted by the 82nd Legislature, all public and private entities authorized to exercise the power of eminent domain in Texas are required to submit a letter to the Comptroller of Public Accounts detailing their legal authority to exercise this power. The letter must be sent by certified, return receipt mail not later than December 31, 2012. (Per the bill, the authority of an entity to exercise the power of eminent domain expires on September 1, 2013, unless the letter has been submitted by the deadline.)

About this form: This form is designed to guide entities in submitting the required information on eminent domain authority. Once the fields have been completed, the form can be printed and mailed via certified, return receipt to the address provided to meet the requirements of the bill.

The Entity further acknowledges that the Comptroller's office is not responsible to submit said letter, nor is it responsible for the Entity's failure to submit said letter as required by law, and that such failure may cause the entity's power of eminent domain to expire on September 1, 2013. The Entity also acknowledges that the Comptroller of Public Accounts is a state agency subject to Chapter 552 of the Texas Gov't Code (the "Texas Public Information Act") and court interpretations thereof, and that the information submitted to this office may be subject to disclosure to the public under Section 552.101, et seq., of the Code.

Under Ch. 559, Government Code, you are entitled to review, request, and correct information we have on file about you, with limited exceptions in accordance with Ch. 552, Government Code.
